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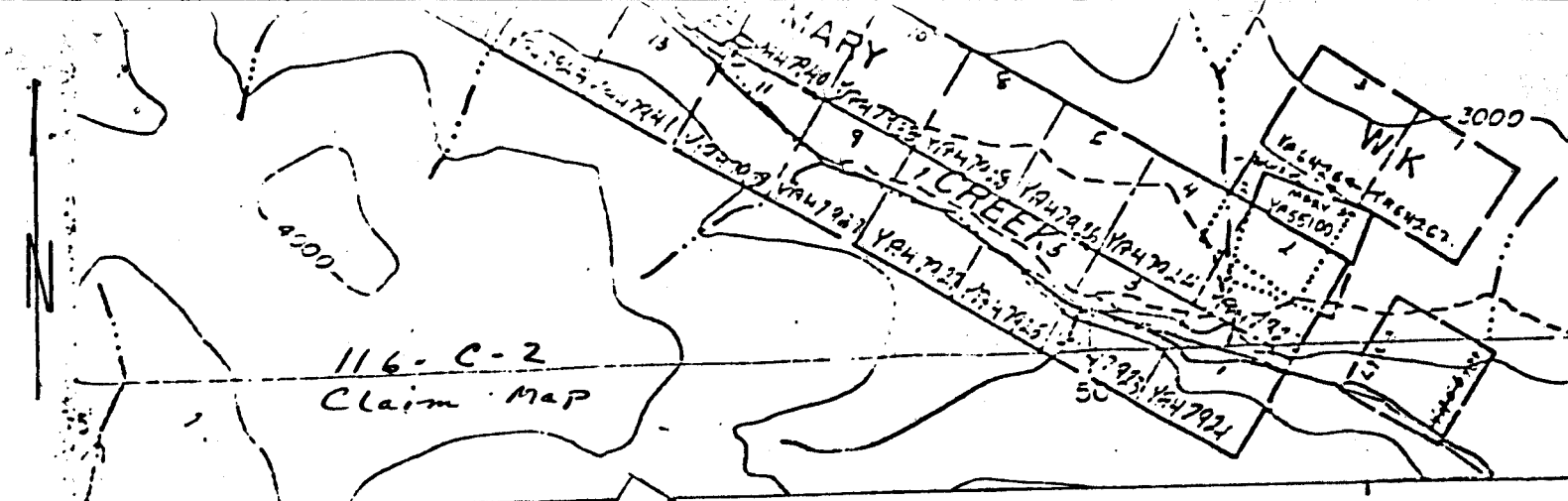

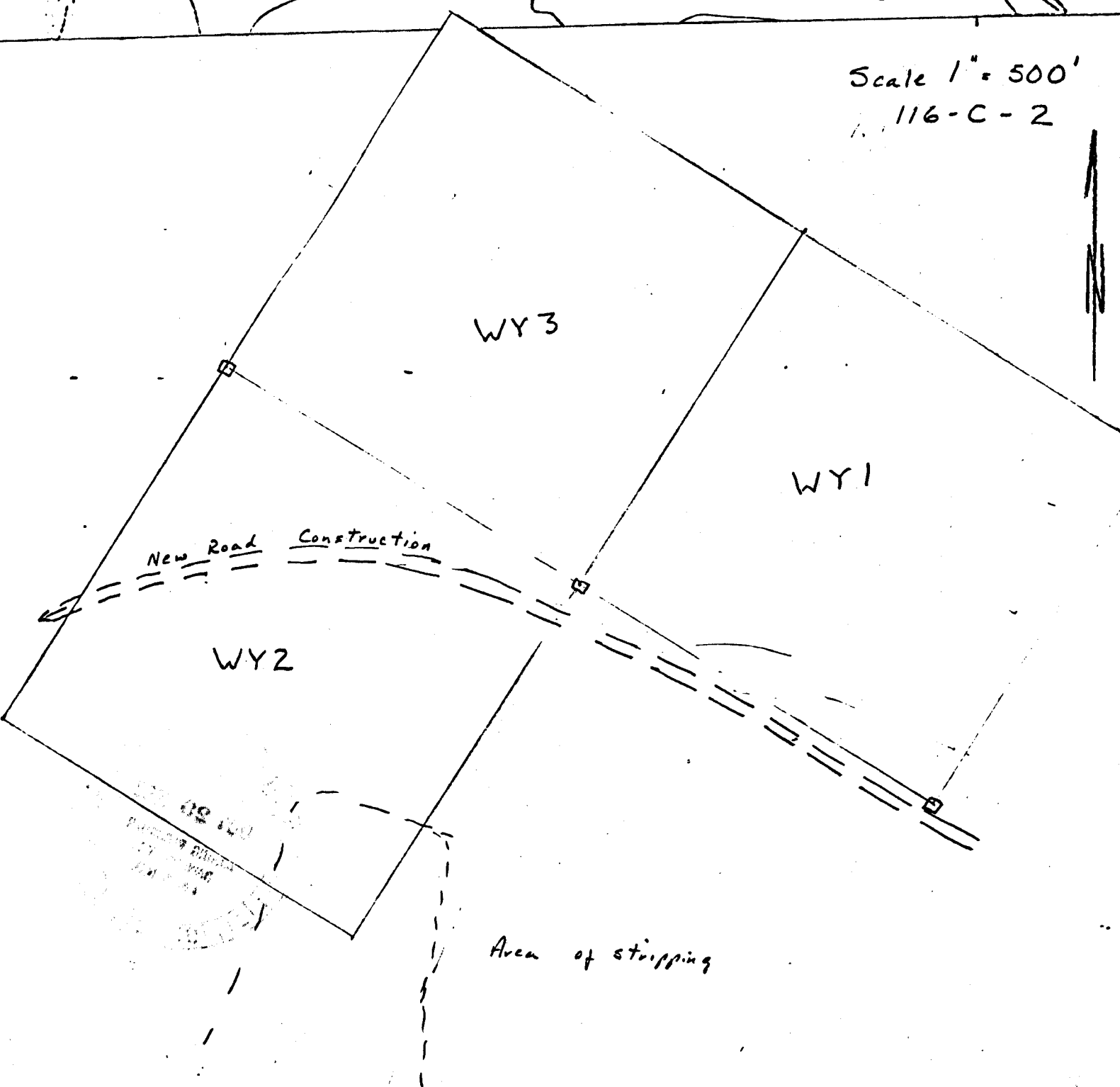

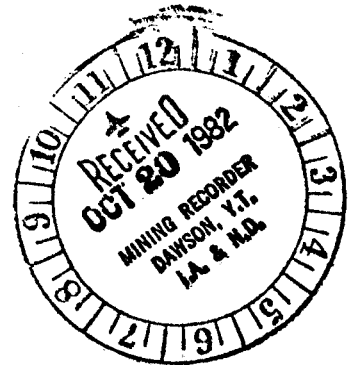

Re: Dimensions and results of stripping on the WY 2 claim YA6426<sup>8</sup>/~~3~~ 116-C-2

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The work carried out on the WY claim was done by Territorial Gold Placers. The road cut through the claim WY 2 totalled a minimum of 1600' long by 150' wide by 2' deep for a total yardage of 17,777yd<sup>3</sup>. The section of the road paralleling the location line just to the south of WY 1 represents another 17,777 yd<sup>3</sup>. The stripped area on the WY 2 claim is approximately 400' by 400' by 60' deep totalling 35,555 yd<sup>3</sup>.

The continuation of placer mining in the Mary and WY claim area is exposing more bedrock and is giving a better understanding of the underlying geology. Three types of economic minerals occur in the claim area: tungsten, mercury and gold. Strong hydrothermal alteration and intense shearing accompanied by carbonate, pyrite and silica mineralization occur in the bedrock exposures in the southern part of the WY 2 and Mary claim. Coarse cinnabar crystals and barite "lumps" have been located in the placer concentrates from the WY 2 stripped area but no mineralization has been found in place. Scheelite and wolframite have also been found in the placer concentrate but have not been located in the bedrock exposure in the stripped bedrock area on the WY 2 claim.

It was hoped that the roadwork and related stripping could expose bedrock. However a careful examination of the road cuts indicate that no bedrock was exposed in cuts up to 6 ft. deep. The cinnabar located in the placer concentrate would appear to be from a source on the WY claims.
