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INTRODUCTION

The Igor property is owned 100% by Nordac Resources Ltd. It consists of 26 mineral claims located at latitude 65°03'N and longitude 134°38'W on claim map 106E/2 in the Mayo Mining District of central Yukon Territory. Claim registration is tabulated below.


The claims cover a copper-uranium prospect which was discovered in 1974 by Ogilvie Joint Venture (Chevron Canada Ltd., Marietta Resources International Limited and Aquitaine Company of Canada Limited). Between 1979 and 1982, thirty-one diamond drill holes totalling 3512 m were completed. At the end of the 1982 drill program the camp and some drill equipment were stored on the property for later use. Unfortunately no further work was done. When the other joint venture partners abandoned their interest, Chevron became the sole owner of the property and subsequently sold its 100% interest to Archer, Cathro & Associates (1981) Limited. Nordac purchased the property in 1995.

1996 WORK PROGRAM

On July 27 Rob Carne and Trans North Air helicopter pilot Pat Dayman spent the day cleaning up wood, scrap metal and an empty drum which has been stored at the camp and on old drill sites. The wood was burned while the other material was flown by helicopter to the Bear River Airstrip, 32 km to the south. The waste was to have been picked up from the airstrip by fixed wing aircraft but this was delayed because of bad weather in late summer. The clean up at the airstrip will be completed in summer 1997.
