## SUMMARY

The 2000 MooseHorn project found trace of gold on the 5th claim. Claims 1, 2, 3, 4 where previously shafted the year before with significant results.

On this fifth claim, holes were steamed in frozen ground loaded with dynamite, and the frozen material was removed by blasting and hand digging.

The shaft has a total of 13 feet of which 6 ft was black muck, 3 ft was gravel and 4 ft was bedrock.

Sampling was done by hand panning, only a few colors was found on contact with the bedrock and gravel, nothing was found in the broken bedrock.

More shafting and further excavation would be usefull for evaluation in the upper end.

## INTRODUCTION

Michel Vincent and Stephane Larose financed and completed a program of digging a shaft by steam and blasting on the MooseHorn property. Supplies and explosives were purchased in Whitehorse and transported to the claims.

Frozen material was steamed, loaded with dynamite and blasted to the 6 ft level where the total of black muck was removed.

From then on, steam only was used to thaw out the gravel and bedrock; gravel was 3 ft and bedrock 4 ft.

## LOCATION AND ACCESS

The MooseHorn property is on map 1150-6, south of Dawson City in the Yukon. Access to the property is by skidoo in winter time. In summer, the property can be reached by road to the mouth of MooseHorn and with an all terrain vehicle to go up the creek 2 miles to the start of the property.

## TOPOGRAPHY and VEGETATION

Topography relief is high. Vegetation is in the creek willows in the creek, on the east side is scrub black spruce and on the west side is beautiful tall white spruce trees.

## MINERAL PROPERTY and OWNERSHIP

The property consist of 18 claims and 2 co-discovery claims owned by Michel Vincent.

## HISTORY

The area was first staked between 1899 and 1900. There is still an old fireplace still standing. The creek was quite shafted by different people over the the last 15 years. The first 5 claims have been mined in the last 3 years.

In 1995, I did shafting project for Joce White on 3 different places on his property in the first 2 miles. We found gold in small amount in each shaft.

In 1998, I staked the top 2 miles and did 3 shafts in the first claim (Xema I P43655). Each shaft had some gold, and in one we found  $\frac{1}{2}$  gr. nugget.

In 1999, I did some shaft in claim Xema 3, I found gold in the shaft dug to the bedrock.

## 2000 FIELD PROGRAM and SAMPLING PROCEDURE

Michel Vincent, Stephane Larose and Claude Audet on Mars 7-2000 travelled to the property and shafted one hole (4' x 4') into frozen ground. Explosives were used with steam. At bedrock level with gravel showing above it, samples were taken. A 5 gal. pail of gravel and bedrock was panned.

A few colors of gold were found.

### CONCLUSION

The result indicate that there still some gold in this fifth claim. It is a weak result, we could have miss the channel fairly easy with only one shaft.

### RECOMMENDATION

More shafts could be done or trenching with a hoe would be the best way to find out.
